

## **BIOGRAPHY: Dr. Raymond CHANG**

Dr. Chang received his B.Sc. training in Biochemistry at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, where he became particularly interested in the fields of neuroscience and neuroimmunology. He later completed his M.Phil. training in neurochemistry and neuroanatomy at the same university. Dr. Chang received a research scholarship by Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst (German Academic Exchange Service) to pursue his doctoral training in neurophysiology and clinical neuroscience at the Institute for Surgical Research at the Ludwig Maximilians University (University of Munich), Germany. Afterwards, he continued his postdoctoral training in neuropharmacology and molecular neuroscience at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, US. During that time, he received the Visiting Research Fellowship Award and the NIH Fellow Award for Research Excellence by the National Institutes of Health. Dr. Chang joined The University of Hong Kong in the summer of 2000 as a research officer, then Research Assistant Professor, and he is now an Assistant Professor. He is also the secretary and founder of HKU Alzheimer's Disease Research Network and investigator in the State Key Laboratory of Brain and Cognitive Sciences, and Research Centre of Heart, Brain, Hormone and Healthy Aging.
