Biography

Martin Jacques is a visiting senior fellow at the LSE IDEAS, a centre for the study of international affairs, diplomacy and grand strategy, and visiting research fellow at the London School of Economics Asia Research Centre. He has travelled extensively in East Asia over the past fifteen years, lived in Hong Kong for three years, and has recently been a visiting professor at Renmin University, Beijing, the International Centre for Chinese Studies, Aichi University, and Ritsumeikan University, Kyoto, and a senior visiting research fellow at the Asia Research Institute, National University of Singapore. Before that he was co-founder of the UK think-tank Demos and editor of the highly influential journal *Marxism Today* until its closure in 1991. He has been a columnist for *The Times* and the *Sunday Times* and deputy editor of the *Independent*, and has written and presented many television programmes for the BBC. He now writes a regular column for the *Guardian*. He is the co-editor and co-author of *The Forward March of Labour Halted* (1981), *The Politics of Thatcherism* (1983), and *New Times* (1989). He lives in London with his son, Ravi.
